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

MAP Testing by Kendall Bourbon

It's that wonderful time of the year, silence fills each classroom, signs hang on the doors saying things like, "Shhhh, we're testing." or "Students at work!" Can you guess? It's time for MAP testing! This year though, things are going to be different than in years previous. This year, MAP testing will all be on the Chromebooks. MAP testing is usually a yearly thing, but this will be the first time we've taken these tests since 2019.

Mrs. Hall is coordinating all of the Chromebooks so she's in charge of the MAP tests. I spoke with Mrs. Hall and this is what she had to say. Commenting on some of the new stuff, she said, "This year, testing will have a much different look. Right now, we're looking to buy mice for each student so that they can use it if they don't like the trackpad. Third through eighth grade are the classes that will be taking the tests." She has spent a lot of time coordinating all of this so that we can have a seamless testing days and get this done as quickly and efficiently as possible. So if you have the time, stop by Mrs. Hall's office and say thanks.

Another thing that she touched down on was the types of tests that we will be taking. Most classes just take differing tests for English and Language Arts and Math, but fifth and eighth grade take an additional science test. Eighth graders that are in Algebra have to take what's called an EOC exam for high school, EOC stands for end of course. Some of the things that MAP testing may involve in the future are a social studies test. This would be something that everyone would take, not just set classes. Mrs. Hall said, "This test is being tried by a few schools, but we won't be using this test for at least another year or two."

Used to, all of the testing was done in the computer lab on big, bulky desktop computers, and, since all of the classes used the same lab, took about three weeks. Now, we are using easily transportable, versatile Chromebooks that can be moved from classroom to classroom. The school as a whole has set aside eight days for the whole school to test. Each session averages at about seventy-five minutes or an hour and fifteen minutes. We in the junior high will be taking our tests with the teacher that teaches the subject we are testing on. So, Mrs. Hedgcoth for ELA and Mrs. Strack for math, and in eighth grade, Mr. Stoverink for science.

Lots of change is going to come this year with our MAP testing. Let's work hard and make this year's MAP testing a success here at NHS!
